The Family Housing Hub coordinates all homeless services for families including emergency shelter and housing assistance. The East Valley and West Valley sites are closed. Families who would normally visit there should call the main line.

The Welcome Center is the Singles Coordinated Entry System and refers singles to permanent housing. The Welcome Center is providing housing assessments to veterans and youth since there are limited resources at this time.
